



Safeguarding and Welfare Requirement: Child Protection

Providers must have and implement a policy, and procedures, to safeguard children.

Uncollected child

Policy statement

In the event that a child is not collected by an authorised adult by their expected collection time, Nursery puts into practice agreed procedures. The child will receive a high standard of care in order to cause as little distress as possible.

We inform parents/carers of our procedures so that, if they are unavoidably delayed, they will be reassured that their children will be properly cared for.

Procedures

- Parents are asked to provide the following specific information when their child starts attending the setting, which is recorded on their child's Registration Form:
 - Home address and telephone numbers: if the parents do not have a telephone, an alternative number must be given, perhaps a neighbour or close relative.
 - Place of work, address and telephone number (if applicable).
 - Mobile telephone number (if applicable).
 - Names, addresses, telephone numbers and signatures of adults who are authorised by the parents to collect their child from the setting, for example a child minder or grandparent.
 - Who has parental responsibility for the child
 - Information about **any person who does not have legal access** to the child.
- On occasions when parents are aware that they will not be at home or in their usual place of work, they inform Nursery in writing of how they can be contacted.
- On occasions when parents, or the persons normally authorised to collect the child, are not able to collect the child, they provide written details of the name, address and telephone number of the person who will be collecting their child. We agree with parents how to verify the identity of the person who is to collect their child.
- Parents are informed that if they are not able to collect the child as planned, they must inform us so that we can begin to take back-up measures. Our contact telephone number is 01865 727939.

- If a child is not collected at their expected collection time, Nursery staff follow the procedures below:
 - The child's file and the daily register is checked for any information about changes to the normal collection routines.
 - If no information is available, parents/carers are contacted at home or at work.
 - If this is unsuccessful, the adults who are authorised by the parents to collect their child, and whose telephone numbers are recorded on the Registration Form, are contacted.
 - All reasonable attempts are made to contact the parents or nominated carers.
 - The child does not leave the premises with anyone other than those named on the Registration Form, noted in their file or signed note on the Register
 - If no-one collects the child within one hour of their expected collection time and there is no-one who can be contacted to collect the child, staff apply the procedures for uncollected children.

- The child stays at the setting, in the care of two of our fully-vetted workers, one of whom will be our Manager or a Deputy until the child is safely collected either by the parents or by a social care worker.
 - Social care will aim to find the parent or relative. If they are unable to do so, the child will become looked after by the local authority.
 - Under no circumstances will staff members go to look for the parent, nor leave the setting premises with the child.
 - Staff ensure that the child is not anxious and will not discuss any concerns in front of them.
 - A full written report of the incident is recorded in the child's file.
- Depending on circumstances, Nursery reserve the right to charge parents for the additional hours worked.
 - Ofsted may be informed
